“Energy Efficiency From Idea to Implementation: How to Bridge the Time Gap?”

11 June 2018

As Ukraine moves towards becoming more energy independent and investing into strategic infrastructure, more projects are coming towards implementation stage. Over EUR 1 billion is committed by various International Finance Institutions as investment into infrastructure. The figures should be larger on the annual basis in the years to come.

Investments in energy efficiency are national priority. However, market participants often state that the cycle “**from preparation to implementation**” is too long. Even when financial resources and political will exist, it still takes long time, until public sees results in modernized public buildings, district heating facilities, wastewater treatment plants or other infrastructure objects. As the investment volume grows it is important to increase **Ukraine’s absorption capacities in efficient project implementation**.

The European-Ukrainian Energy Agency gathers market stakeholders to discuss each stage of the project cycle: from idea generation, through feasibility study and procurement, until the modernized facility serves its customers in an efficient way. We are pleased to invite those who deal with energy efficiency on the policy level, during financing, implementation and the evaluation / verification of results.




